Wayne Morrison also put one of his best efforts forth against Memorial as he practiced the art in which he has excelled for two years—attacking defenses and presses and dissecting them like a surgeon.

Jack Flaherty catalyzed the team all year long. He quarterbacked our all-important press attacks and covered the prime opponent a great deal of the time. His finest hour was the Andover game.

Joe Cormier best revealed what he meant to us by his offensive efforts versus Lowell; against the big 6'6" Carmichael of Andover, he displayed his ability to cover the big post man.

Steve Singelais, who was a great offensive cog all year, turned defensive specialist down the stretch. His most outstanding performances were superb defensive stints versus Aronie of Concord and Cooper of Andover. His work opposite Marvelous Marv at B.C. will long be remembered by us (and by Safford).

Paul Jones, hampered by an injury early in the season, had to be content with the role of sixth man when a big man was needed. SENIORS

The Class of 1972 has witnessed and participated in some sweeping changes in the program, policies, and atmosphere of Lexington High School in the past four years. Never in the one hundred and eighteen years of Lexington High School history has there been such a dynamic period. We are seeing a new kind of school emerge, one that sees education as an experience in living rather than an isolated intellectual exercise. The school thus becomes a part of the community and the community part of the school.

Your class has not only experienced these changes but has also participated in their initiation. It might be interesting to review some of the innovations that members of the Class of 1972 have been involved in during their four years at Lexington High School.

The major change in school organization has been the shift from a horizontal to a vertical basis for assignment of students to units. This was accomplished in your junior year on the recommendation of a student-faculty committee that had worked most of the previous year studying both arrangements in this and other schools. Modification of our level structure, including the abandonment of the AP label, has also evolved on the recommendation of a student-faculty levels committee.

Accompanying the change in unit organization, a new design for student government and for student-faculty participation in school affairs was created by a task force of students appointed by the SGO in the spring of 1970. The resulting Student-Faculty Government was initiated in 1970-1971. Its major contribution in that year was the creation of an Open Campus Steering Committee to carry out the necessary groundwork for the eventual institution of such a program.

Curricular changes during your four years at Lexington High School have included the launching of the EWOW program, the rapid development of elective opportunities in all departments, including the all-elective English program, and an innovative Physical Education program for juniors and seniors.


Another significant change has been the shift from PTA to PTSA, with greater emphasis on student involvement and informal discussion meetings for students, teachers, and parents. Out of these meetings developed the Summer Cooperative Program, which hopefully will become a permanent institution.

Your class has not only "broken the ice" in student participation but has also helped to create the machinery and the precedent for assuring ever-increasing opportunities for student leadership and involvement. You have made a significant impact not only within the school but also in the school department and town government. The service of a member of your class on the School Committee was a notable "first" which may have triggered the appointment of a Student Advisory Committee to the Board of Selectmen. Future classes will be indebted to you for your pioneering in this important extension of the educational program at Lexington High School. The expression "Education Without Walls" is having a more and more prophetic ring.

The school prepared for a new unit organization to go into effect in 1970-1971. A successful year in sports achieved for us the Middlesex League All-Sports Trophy. As sophomores, we began to feel a part of the school. Gradually the buildings around us changed into people and faces we would never forget.















We became more aware of our individuality and our responsibilities during our junior year. Licenses, jobs, and underclass privileges helped us realize our increasing independence. The prom, SAT's, the Junior Show, and cheering our basketball team on to a victory in the States made the year especially memorable. Greater involvement advanced us toward uniqueness, but graduation still seemed so far away.











Almost suddenly we found ourselves seniors, suffering from a slump we started months too early but loving every minute of it. Four years ago we joined to pursue a common goal. Seeking maturity we have grown into one—Lexington 1972. Here we are together for the last time.




