



Sunshine Sketches of a Little Town is a story collection written by Canadian academic and humorist Stephen Leacock. Though published first in 1912, it continues to be popular as a classic of Canadian literature and one with enduring appeal. Although largely drawn from his experiences while at his summer home in Orillia, Ontario. Leacock notes in the preface of the book that the subject small town, Mariposa, "is not a real town. On the contrary, it is about seventy or eighty of them. You may find them all the way from Lake Superior sea, with the same square streets and the same maple trees and the same churches and hotels."
